Master of Theological Studies

Theology, Spirituality and the Arts Stream

Program Description:

The Fall term, September 2019, saw the implementation of a new stream within the Master of Theological Studies. The MTS is a first degree in theology that complements previous professional training. Within the MTS the Theology, Spirituality, and the Arts Stream is designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills necessary to analyze and interpret the theological dimension of the arts and culture.

The goals of the stream are to:

- Receive focused academic content in the area of theology, spirituality and the arts within the existing learning objectives and structure of the MTS
- Explore the range of ways that the arts and arts-related vocations intersect with theological understanding
- Build relationships with artists, art experts, academics, therapist, and the public and private cultural institutions of Toronto and beyond
- Use interdisciplinary methodologies from theology, aesthetics theory, art history, pastoral theology, liturgy and material culture studies, and other related disciplines.

Program Requirements:

Twenty credits are required to complete the M.T.S. program. It can be done in two years or completed on a part-time basis. An overall course average of B- is required to graduate. The Theology, Spirituality and the Arts stream requires a minimum of 8 credits.

For the stream, admission requirements are the same as for the Regis M.T.S., the Emmanuel M.T.S. as well as the St. Michael's M.T.S. with the addition of a declaration of intent to pursue the Theology, Spirituality and the Arts stream. The norm is to take the required introductory course for the new stream as well as the M.T.S.'s required introductory courses in Theology and in Bible before, or simultaneously with other courses. Before registration, all courses for full-time and part-time students, including any variation from the norm, require the approval of each college's Basic Degree Director and an advisor for the Theology, Spirituality, and the Arts stream.

1. Core requirements for the M.T.S.: Bible, History, Theology, Moral theology and Pastoral theology

Regis: 15 credits

Emmanuel: 12 credits St. Michael's: 12 credits

Within these M.T.S. core requirements, since Regis requires 15 credits, while Emmanuel and St. Michael's require only 12 credits, Regis students choose at least 3 courses that are also on the approved list of eligible courses for the stream.

- 2. Required introductory course: "Theology, Spirituality and the Arts"
- 3. Additional Stream requirements carved out from the free electives for the M.T.S. free electives: Regis (3 stream credits), Emmanuel (6 stream credits), St. Michael's (6 stream credits)

- 4. Electives: Students choose an additional 2 credits from the approved list of eligible courses for the stream.
- 5. Synthesis paper (2 stream credits)

Assessment

All courses in the MTS stream require approval by the TST Curriculum Committee. The MTS Synthesis Paper/Summative Exercise for the new stream will be graded by two faculty appointed by each college's Basic Degree Director in consultation with the advisor for the Theology, Spirituality, and the Arts stream.

As of October 2020, there were only two students enrolled in the stream, both Emmanuel students, one FT and the other PT.

No assessment has occurred for this stream as of October 2020 as it was just implemented in September 2019. Efforts have concentrated on recruiting students for it.
